Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

Mass Readings:

Deuteronomy 8: 2-3, 14b-16a Psalm 147: 12-13, 14-15, 19-20 1 Corinthians 10: 16-17 John 6: 51-58

Discuss

Share the readings as a family and then discuss:

- 1. The first reading reminds us not to forget God because He does not forget us. Why do you think we forget to think about God sometimes? How can we remember to think about Him?
- 2. The Responsorial Psalm is about praising God for all the good things He has done. What do you want to praise God for?
- 3. How does food nourish you?
- 4. How do you think receiving Jesus in the Eucharist nourishes you?

Share:

As Catholics, we believe the Eucharist is truly the Body and Blood of Jesus and not a symbol. Jesus loves us so much that He wants to be fully with us! St. Francis of Assisi once wrote: "What wonderful majesty! What stupendous condescension! O sublime humility! That the Lord of the whole universe, God and the Son of God, should humble Himself like this under the form of a little bread, for our salvation!"

Pray

This week we pray another sequence at mass called "Laud Sion" or "Praise Zion." Pray this as a family together. The shorter version is on the next page.

Do

The word Eucharist comes from the Greek meaning "thanksgiving." Every day this week put a note on the door of each member of your family that says why you are thankful for them. Place a bowl under or near a crucifix and place a note each day that tells Jesus what you are thankful to Him for.
